


For God so loved the world that he gave His only begotten Son that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life (John 1:16). This world is subdued to corruption; therefore, let us not be distracted, for creation awaits in eager expectations for the children of God to be revealed. They are under frustrations and are waiting to be liberated, and if we are distracted or focused on what is carnal, there won't have any impact. As Christians, again, let's look at the eternal price (Romain 8:20).

As Christians, let us watch and pray so we don't fall into the temptation of living just for this world. Let us abound in the good works and abound in living in sanctification, not being conformed to the pattern of this world but transformed by allowing God to renew our minds. In our good works, let us introduce the gospel to this world. If you were preaching to one person, now preach to two. If you were praying for one sick individual, pray for two, and as you do this, bear in mind that even when you don't receive a reward here on earth, you will get your crown in heaven.





And on judgement day, it won't be a day of condemnation because we are already saved; we should look at it as a crowning moment according to the work we did on earth. Our work is going to follow us (Revelation 14:15). Invest in what truly matters. Your eternal life began when you accepted Christ; live out this reality purposefully.
